Bell, J. Bowyer. TERROR OUT OF ZION, LEHI AND THE PALESTINE UNDER-GROUND, 1929-1949. New York: St. Martin's Press, 1977. 374 pp. \$13.95. This is a responsible, objective account of the development of Jewish terrorism in Palestine, by an author

well-acquainted with the field. Mr. Bell deals with the right-wing Israeli underground militia. Here is the welltold, authentic story of Avraham Stern's Lahomey Heruth Israel and of Menachem Begin's Irgun Zvai Leumi (IZL). Here are accounts of the sinking of the Patria in November 1940, with its heavy loss of Jewish lives, the blowing up of the King David Hotel (1946), and the massacre at Deir Yassin in April 1948. The rise of the Stern gang is told bomb by bomb. The emergence of Begin to the leadership of Irgun is related in detail. Begin openly boasted of his own role in the Deir Yassin massacre (April 1948). Bowyer's volume is especially interesting not only in the light of Zionist charges as to Arab "terrorism". Mr. Begin has now become the Prime Minister of The book well portrays the ideological roots of the now dominant Israeli right (LIKUD). It should make for wide and interesting study in high places. Both author and publisher are to be congratulated for having it published at the very moment when the Israeli right has come into power under the Begin leadership.

Benvenisti, Meron. JERUSALEM: THE TORN CITY. Minneapolis:
 University of Minnesota Press, 1977. 407 pp. \$15.00.
 Benvenisti, Deputy Mayor of Jerusalem, is especially interested in Arab-Jewish relations, and believes that coexistence between the two communities will continue uneasy as long as there is no political settlement.

Cattan, Henry. PALESTINE AND INTERNATIONAL LAW: THE LEGAL ASPECTS OF THE ARAB-ISRAELI CONFLICT. Second Edition. With a Foreword by Dr. W. T. Mallison, Jr. London: Longman Group, Ltd. 362 pp. This is a revised edition of a book brought out originally in 1973. Basically, Mr. Cattan's book is an historical-legal treatise which begins with an historical intro-It then takes up the Zionist claims to Palestine, the invalidity of the British mandate, the UN General Assembly's resolution of November 29, 1947 recommending the partition of Palestine, the illegitimacy of Israel, the problem of sovereignty over Palestine, Israel's violations of UN resolutions and of international law, violations of human rights, the Security Council Resolution 242 of 1967, the problem of Palestinian selfdetermination, and the solution of the Arab-Israeli conflict. Mr. Cattan's work is no mere academic thesis dealing with a theoretical problem. He has written two other books dealing with the legal aspects of the Palestine problem, and two others treating of oil concessions in the Middle East and their development.

Born in Jerusalem, Mr. Cattan writes with much learning and much experience. He presented the Arab case on behalf of the Palestinians in the UN General Assembly in 1947. He has served on many occasions as an adviser on the Palestine issue to the

League of Arab States. This is a first class presentation of the legal aspects of the Arab-Israeli conflict which should be in the hands of all those who deal with the problem or study it. The book is heavily documented and the author has included 54 documents in an extensive appendix. All readers will find this authoritative treatise most helpful in considering the Palestine question.

For example, there are essays on early Iron Age bronzes from Macedonia, problems of the historical geography of northeast Macedonia, causes of the third Macedonian war, the dynamics of fourth century Macedonian imperialism, the image of Alexander the Great in 17th century France, etc. The essays carry us back almost to the most ancient of days and constitute a fitting introduction to sound study, not only of Ancient Greece and the Balkan area, but to the wider areas of the Middle The Institute for Balkan Studies is certainly to be congratulated for making these historical essays available conveniently to interested scholars.
- Spiridonakis, B. G. ESSAYS OF THE GREEK WORLD IN THE BALKANS DURING THE TURKOKRATIA. Thessaloniki: Institute for Balkan Studies, 1977. 171 pp. As the title of this volume suggests, this is a study of the Greek world in the Balkan peninsula and the Aegean Islands during the era of the Ottoman Empire, ca. 1453 into the opening of the 20th century.

There are six chapters, the first of which lays the ground-work for a study of geography and history. Then follow chapters dealing with the nature of Greek geographic environment, main thoroughfares and cities, Hellenism and the Balkans, Greek demographic dynamics in the Balkans, and Greek population movements during the Ottoman period. The book is thoroughly well-documented, both in the extensive annotations at the end of each chapter and in an excellent bibliography. Students of Greek history, the Balkan area and the beginnings of revolt will find this volume especially useful.

Vanezis, P. N. CYPRUS: THE UNFINISHED AGONY. Levittown, New York: Transatlantic Arts, 1977. 139 pp. \$9.75. An analysis by a Greek Cypriot official who, however, chides the Greek ethnic element for their pursuit of enosis. Favors a unitary state.




